

English: Active Learners Classic Generation

Black History Month sees us focus on trailblazers and the theme of 2024, which is rewriting narratives. The story of Rosa Parks will help us explore this and the lyrics of famous activist songs to write our own poems.

Maths: Confidence, Bold, Active Leaners

We will begin our year with a focus on place value and counting. Using Maths No Problem as our lead, Year 5 will be counting, ordering and comparing numbers to one million. Year 6 will doing exactly the same within ten million. We will also be rounding numbers to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand. Using rounding as a key to checking our calculations, we will then move on to addition and subtraction.

Science: Active Learners Partnerships Knowledge


